Justice T Ramachandran was born in Ottappalam in 1938 to Shri. N.P Rama Poduwal and Smt. Sreedevi Pothuvalasiar. After completing his education at Kerala Varma College in Thrissur, he graduated in law from Government Law College, Madras. Having begun his judicial career as a Munsiff in 1969, he later served as a Sub Judge and was later appointed as the District Judge. He also had a stint as a member of the Forest Tribunal. Regarded as an exemplar of fairness and earned respect, in 1996 he was elevated as the judge, High Court of Kerala. He passed away on December 16, 1997, while serving as the judge.

# RULES & REGULATIONS

## I. INTRODUCTION

The XIV<sup>th</sup> All India Moot Court Competition for Justice T.Ramachandran Memorial Ever Rolling Trophy under the auspices of Government Law College, Thrissur will be held from 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2026 at the college premises.

## II. ELIGIBILITY

- The competition will be open to all the Law colleges, Law schools and Law Departments recognized by the Bar Council of India. The participation is limited to undergraduate students in law both in the 3 year and 5 year schemes undergoing regular courses.
- Only one team can register from a particular Law College/ Law School/Law Department for participation in the competition. In the event of multiple registrations from the same College/Law School/Law department, the team which submits a letter from the Head/Dean of the Institution/Moot Court Committee, authorizing them to participate on behalf of the College/Law School/Law department shall be eligible to register.
- No additional member or team mentor or faculty member shall be allowed to accompany the Team.
- Travel expenses shall be borne by the participating team.

## III. REGISTRATION

- Interested institutions shall intimate participation through email [mcs.glct@gmail.com](mailto:mcs.glct@gmail.com) on or before **12<sup>th</sup> December, 2025**.
- The provisional registration for the XIV<sup>th</sup> All India Moot Court Competition for Justice T. Ramachandran Memorial Ever Rolling Trophy can be done through this link <https://glctmoot.wordpress.com/> During the provisional registration the participants are expected to pay registration fee of **Rs.1500/- per team** on or before **18<sup>th</sup> December, 2025**. The amount once paid is not refundable.
- The participating teams will have to register the fee by way of bank transfer/NEFT. The transfer of registration amount should be complete at the time of registration so that details of the same are to be mentioned in the registration form.

- After the provisional registration, there will be a memorial evaluation, after which **20 teams** will be selected for the preliminary round.The result shall be intimated to the selected teams on **10<sup>th</sup> January 2026**.
- Each of the selected 20 teams shall pay an additional fee of **Rs.3500/-** on or before **13<sup>th</sup> January, 2026**.
- A code number will be assigned to each team and that number alone shall be marked on the memorial and no indication shall be given for identifying the institution of the participants.

### **IV. GENERAL**

#### **4.1 TEAM COMPOSITION**

- Each participating team shall comprise of either two (2) or three (3) members.
- In case of two (2) members, both the members shall be designated as speakers.
- In case of three (3) members, two (2) members shall be designated as speakers and one(1) member shall be designated as the researcher.
- If the team comprises of only speakers, the team shall be ineligible to attend the researcher interview.

## 4.2 LANGUAGE

- The official language of the Competition shall be English.
- All competition rounds, memoranda and compendiums must be in English.

## 4.3 DRESS CODE

The dress code to be adhered during the Competition is –

- Ladies:** White Shirt/Kurta, Black Blazer, Black Trousers/Salwar and Black Shoes.
- **Gentlemen:** White Shirt, Black Blazer, Black Trousers, Black Tie and Black Shoes.
- The participants shall wear the badge provided by the organising committee throughout the days of the competition.

## 4.4 COMPETITION FORMAT

The format of the competition will be four tier which is as follows,

Preliminary Rounds (online)
Quarter Finals
Semi Finals
Finals

#### **4.4.1. PRELIMINARY ROUNDS**

- The Preliminary round shall be conducted in two stages by **online** on **January 16 &17th, 2026.**
- In each stage, the teams will represent either the petitioner or respondent for that round. The sides will be determined by the way of draw of lots.
- The teams shall face a separate team in both these stages.
- Each preliminary round shall be for 60 minutes in total.
- Each team will be given a total time of 25 minutes for oral pleadings.
- Five minutes will be allotted for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- Only one (1) Speaker from each Team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- Time should be equally apportioned amongst the speakers.

#### **4.4.2 QUARTER-FINAL ROUND**

- Quarter finals will be conducted in the college campus on **January 30<sup>th</sup>,2026**
- The top eight (8) teams shall qualify for the quarter-final round.
- The qualification to the Quarter-Finals will be based on double wins. In case of short age of teams with double wins, then the highest aggregate score in the preliminaries with at least one win will be considered.
- Each Quarter-Final round shall be for 70 minutes in total.
- Each team will be given a total time of 30 minutes for oral pleadings.
- Five minutes will be allotted for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- Only one (1) Speaker from each Team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- Time should be equally apportioned amongst the speakers.
- The Quarter-Finals will be a knock-out round.

#### **4.4.3 SEMI-FINAL ROUND**

- The winning teams from each quarter final round shall qualify for the semifinal round, which scheduled to be on **January 31<sup>st</sup>,2026.**
- Each Semi-Final round shall be for 90 minutes in total.
- Each team will be given a total time of 40 minutes for oral pleadings.
- Five minutes will be allotted for rebuttal/ sur-rebuttal.
- Only one (1) Speaker from each team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- Time should be equally apportioned amongst the speakers.
- The Semi-Finals will be a knock-out round.

#### **4.4.4 FINAL ROUND**

- The winning teams from each semi-final round shall qualify for the final round.
- The Final round shall be for 90 minutes in total.
- Each team will be given a total time of 40 minutes for oral pleadings.
- Five minutes will be allotted for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- Only one (1) Speaker from each Team shall be permitted to rebut/sur-rebut.
- Time should be equally apportioned amongst the speakers.

#### **4.5 MEMORIALS**

Each Team shall prepare Memorials from the side of Petitioner and Respondent.

##### **4.5.1 FORMAT SPECIFICATIONS**

- All memoranda must be typed and printed on A4 sized white paper with font size 12, font type Times New Roman, line spacing 1.5 and justified alignment.
- Citations for the memoranda are to be in the form of footnotes only. Endnotes are not permitted. Footnotes must not contain substantive pleadings and should not be communicative.
- Harvard Blue Book (21<sup>th</sup> Edition) citation format shall be followed.
- For footnotes, the formatting specifications are:
  - Font type: Times New Roman
  - Font Size: 10 Single Line Spacing

##### **4.5.2 CONTENTS OF THE MEMORIAL**

- Cover Page
- Table of Contents
- Table of Abbreviations
- Index of Authorities
- Statement of Jurisdiction
- Summary of Facts
- Issues Raised
- Summary of Arguments
- Arguments Advanced
- Prayer

The cover page must only include the following in justified alignment except mentioned otherwise,

- Team Code on the right-hand top corner
- Name of the forum being approached
- Case type and number
- Case name
- Memorandum on behalf of petitioner/applicant or respondent.

- » The body of the Memorandum shall not exceed 25 typed pages. The cover page, table of contents, index of authorities, jurisdiction and statement of facts, annexure, appendices, if any and back cover are not included in these 25 pages.
- » Any issue or pleading, not discussed within the body of the memorandum shall not be permitted to be raised in the Court.
- » Memorials should be mailed in PDF format.
- » The teams shall submit soft copies of their memorials through the link that will be provided or via email to [mcs.glet@gmail.com](mailto:mcs.glet@gmail.com) on or before **05<sup>th</sup> January, 2026 11:59 PM**.
- » Five sets of memorials shall be submitted. Out of this, two copies may be despatched so as to reach the organizers on or before **07<sup>th</sup> January, 2026**. Other three copies of memorial shall be presented at the time of registration at the college on **30<sup>th</sup> January, 2026**.
- » Teams are required to send the soft copies and hard copies of the memorials well in time, taking all contingencies into account.
- » The hard copies must be identical to the soft copy. Violation of this Rule would entail disqualification from the Competition.
- » Teams shall carry their own hard copies of the memorials for personal use. No hard copies of memorials submitted by the Team to the Moot Court Society shall be provided to such Team for their personal use.

» The Memorials shall be spiral bound. The following colour scheme shall be followed for the Cover Page of the Memorial:

**Petitioners: Blue**

**Respondents: Red**

» **Identity of the team or names of the participants or their institution name must not be disclosed in any form on the memoranda or compendiums. Any such violation shall lead to disqualification of the team.**

- The organisers reserve the right to take appropriate action for any unethical, unprofessional, immoral conduct or behaviour of the participants at the venues of competition and accommodation.
- If any situation arises which is not contemplated by the Rules, the decision of the Organizing Committee shall remain final and binding.
- The organisers reserve the right to vary, alter, modify and/or repeal any provision of the Rules if so required.
- Certificates will be issued only at valedictory function.
- Those who are arranging their own accommodation are responsible for reaching the college on time, failing to report on time amounts to disqualification.
